"Embracing aspects of the Queen's realm, the diamonds were sourced from the Argyle Diamond Mine in Western Australia. Extremely rare, pink diamonds comprise just 0.03% of the world diamond output. It is a mystery as to how the pink diamonds achieve their colour but is believed to relate to the extreme pressure beneath the earth's surface," said Dispensing Optician, Roger Pope.
